V.A. News & Info.....

1- Thanks to funds raised by the Milwaukee Preservation Alliance (MPA), including individual donations and a \$5,000 matching grant from the National Trust for Historic Preservation, for signs that were manufactured and installed along I-94 to direct visitors to the Milwaukee Soldiers Home National Historic Landmark District.

2- New burial regulations effective today will now allow VA to automatically pay the maximum amount allowable under law to most eligible surviving spouses more quickly and efficiently, without the need for a written application. Under former regulations, VA paid burial benefits on a reimbursement basis, which required survivors to submit receipts for relatively small one-time payments that VA generally paid at the maximum amount permitted by law. "VA is committed to improving the speed and ease of delivery of monetary burial benefits to Veterans' survivors during their time of need," said Acting VA Secretary Sloan Gibson. "The recent changes allow VA to help these survivors bear the cost of funerals by changing regulations to get them the benefits more quickly." 3- U.S. Navy Command baseball caps are making a comeback by popular demand. Starting Sept. 1, Navy commanding officers will be authorized to allow their sailors to wear command ball caps with Navy Working Uniforms, Types I, II and III.

4-Did you know that there is a quick and easy way to support our veterans, here in Milwaukee, and all it will cost you is the price of breakfast or lunch? (And you get to eat that breakfast or lunch!) Conveniently located on 35th and Wisconsin Ave., in Milwaukee, Troop Café is right on your way downtown. 


Congratulations to the American Legion Family at Post 449, and to anyone who assisted

REQUEST YOUR ABSENTEE BALLOT

As part of the Legion's "Get Out The Vote" (GOTV) program, Post 449 is encouraging all its members to vote. One easy way to vote is by Absentee ballot. A form to request an Absentee ballot is located in the front entrance on the military display cabinent.

- ♦ ANYONE can vote by absentee ballot (you don't have to be injured, etc.)
- You can request an absentee ballot anytime starting Jan. 1, 2014 for this year's elections.
- If you are not registered to vote in the city/town/village you now live, you must register before you can obtain an absentee ballot.
- Due to two recent court injunctions, absentee voters are not presently required to provide a photo ID before obtaining ballot.

Voting By Absentee Ballot


- If you requested that an absentee ballot be sent to you, it will be mailed via US mail. The envelope will contain instructions for the ballot's return, as well as a return, postage-paid envelope. Make sure you sign your absentee ballot envelope and have your signature witnessed.
- You may cast an absentee ballot in the City Clerk's office from 8:15 am to 4:30 pm beginning on the third Monday before each election. The last day to cast an in-person absentee ballot at the Clerk's office is 5:00 pm on the Friday before each election.

Permanent Absentee Voters

- Registered electors who are indefinitely confined because of age, physical illness, or infirmity may request that an absentee ballot be sent automatically for every election.

Another JPAC (Joint POW/MIA Accounting Command)

Disgrace - During the hearing, Congressman Wilson read into the record a letter from Congressman Glen Thompson. The letter described JPAC's mishandling of the case of Major Lewis P. Smith, MIA in Laos, May 30, 1968. We excerpt the following from Congressman Thompson's letter.

[Begin Excerpt]

As the Subcommittee reviews and considers the future of the POW/MIA Office and Agencies, it is essential to ensure that the Department of Defense is correctly prioritizing recovery missions. Recent problems and mistakes raise concerns that deserve our immediate attention, including a troubling situation that has arisen within the Joint POW/MIA Accountability Command (JPAC), which involves the case of Major Lewis P. Smith III, a constituent of mine who was listed as Missing in Action in May of 1968.

Major Smith was trained on the T-38 and C130 aircraft, and was assigned to the 20th Tactical Air Support Squadron, Pleiku Air Base. During combat in Vietnam, Major Smith piloted a Cessna O2A "Sky know these are difficult economic times, but we really need your Master" aircraft in Saravane Province, Laos. During the mission, Smith encountered enemy fire, resulting in the crash of his plane. Electronic signals were heard at the scene, indicating that he had survived the crash, but he was not rescued, and is now honored on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial: Panel 62W - Line 2.

Major Smith's family has been working with JPAC for many years to recover his remains. The excavation site in Laos is has been on the list for over three years and the trip to excavate the crash site has been postponed twice, allegedly due to budget pressures and sequestration.

Following these events, Major Smith's family reached out to me to help with their efforts to bring Major Smith's remains home. Over the past several months, I have worked with the House Appropriations Committee to ensure the accounts for JPAC are fully funded. Despite this work, Major Smith's family recently received devastating news that the recovery site in Laos had been flooded by a newly built dam. As a result, the task of recovering Major Smith's remains has been exponentially complicated.

Furthermore, the dam construction in Laos was planned and built over the course of a decade. During that time, JPAC was fully aware of this project, yet failed to complete the mission before it was too late. This series of events brings into question the adequacy of coordination between JPAC and officials from partner nations and the process by which JPAC prioritizes recovery missions. Ultimately, I remain concerned that JPAC's failure to recover this site could have been prevented. If this is found to be the case, corrective action must be taken to ensure this does not reoccur in the future.

It is vital that families do not have to experience the repeated anguish of losing a loved one for a second time because of an avoidable oversight, such as what happened to Major Smith's family in Pennsylvania. Those who made the ultimate sacrifice for our country and their family members deserve much better. [End Excerpt]




