

<u>David.</u> He rocked Goliath to a very deep sleep.





Nurse & Post 449 Legionnaire, Phyllis Pfeifer

In 1940. I entered Misericordia Hospital School of Nursing. as a Student Nurse. This was a three-year program. The hospital was located at 22nd Nurse Corps. for 1&1/2 years and Juneau in Milwaukee. The Catholic nuns were from a Canadian order. They were strict. but caring. We had the opportunity of attending Mass in the hospital chapel.

In nursing, one sees the serious side of life. In 1941. Pearl Harbor was attacked and the U.S. entered World War II. Prayers were said for the war. our studies. and ourselves.

We lived at the Nurse's Residence across from the hospital. In our senior year. we spent five months at Milwaukee County Hospital. and lived in a dorm nearby. Twenty girls started and thirteen graduated in 1943. The seven had dropped out during the f

After graduation. I worked as a Graduate at Misericordia Hospital: second shift: (3 - 11) in the Nursery. I then passed my Wisconsin State Nursing exams and became a Registered Nurse.

I transferred to South View Contagious Disease unit, working for the Milwaukee Health



Department. I handled many types of contagious diseases including Polio.

I served in the U. S. Army (1945 - 46). We were overseas in Hawaii when the War ended. We had been replacements for the older nurses who had already served. We were then sent by ship to Okinawa (now an island of Japan). We had a mass on board the ship, out on deck, after a Typhoon struck off the coast of Okinawa. This was a Mass of Thanksgiving for getting us safely through the Storm. Once on Okinawa mass was held in a tent with our Chaplain in the open spaces. (1945).

After three weeks, we flew to Korea and were assigned to different units. This was about six years prior to the start of the Korea War. My three girlfriends and I, among others, were assigned to a General Hospital. north of Seoul, for about a year.

These life experiences were challenges when I needed to rely of my faith and use it to the best of my ability, all at the young age of 18 - 22.






