V.A. News & Info.....

1- This year the Veterans Disability Compensation and Veterans Pension payments will increase by 1.7%. The increase is based on the 2014 rate of inflation (consumer price index). If you are interested in getting a copy of the new 2015 rate tables, please contact me

2- TRICARE provides a world-class pharmacy benefit to all eligible Uniformed Services Members, including TRICARE for Life (TFL) beneficiaries entitled to Medicare Part A and B based on their age, disability and/or end-stage renal disease. Eligible beneficiaries may fill prescription medications at military treatment facility(MTF) pharmacies; through the TRICARE Pharmacy Home Delivery option; at TRICARE retail network pharmacies; and at non-network pharmacies. To have a prescription filled, beneficiaries need a written prescription and a valid Uniformed Services Identification Card. To update information and obtain a valid Identification Card, beneficiaries should contact the: Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS). TFL Beneficiaries, who turned age 65 on April 1, 2001, or later, must be enrolled in Medicare Part B to use the pharmacy program. TFL Beneficiaries who turned age 65 before April 1, 2001, are not required to be enrolled in Medicare Part B for the pharmacy program, but are required to be enrolled in Medicare Part B for all other benefits available under TRICARE for Life.

3-The Department of Veterans Affairs is using IBM's Watson technology in a pilot to assist physicians in helping accelerate the proess of evidence-based medical decision making. The Veterans Health Administration (VHA) will also work with Watson for a

clinical focus supporting veterans with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). Watson will be studied to see how it can help VHA clinicians quickly make sense of an overwhelming amount of data. Watson is able to distill evidence and knowledge within seconds.

JPAC (Joint POW/MIA Accounting Command) Report: 107 IDENTIFICATIONS OF MIA REMAINS MADE IN 2014 -

That was a Stars & Stripes headline on January 22, 2015. According to an article written by Waytt Olsen:

"The 107 identifications for 2014 by the Joint POW/MIA Accounting Command came primarily from remains linked to the Korean War (42), World War II (36) and the site of a 1952 crash of an Air Force cargo plane into Mount Gannett in Alaska (17).

The number of identifications from the Vietnam War, at 12, was about half the average of 21 IDs made annually over the previous nine years."

"John Byrd, JPAC's laboratory director, credits the increase to a mix of new procedures, increased lab space and developments in technology.... The 107 remains identified won't be officially "accounted" for until their nearest kin are contacted and they agree with JPAC's findings, Byrd said."
