





The following is an excerpt from Abandoned in Place.

[Begin Excerpt] One can only imagine the sense of anticipation in the room. Those in attendance listened closely as the General outlined the rigid security requirements for Operation Camshaft. Camshaft, the U.S.

Pacific Command's (PACCOM) classified code name for the mission at hand, would be one of the largest and most secret military operations since the Vietnam War.

If all went well, it would be a strike of surgical precision. If successful, they will have carried out the soldiers' unwritten code: never leave a man behind on the battlefield. Their mission, the rescue of American Prisoner of War held in Laos six years after the end of Vietnam War.

A mission of this importance required the utmost secrecy. So when Brigadier General Michael Nelson, Director for Operations, Headquarters U.S. Pacific Command, reminded the military men gathered in this room of the strict security requirements surrounding this mission, there was no doubt as to their attentiveness. General Nelson cautioned those in the rescue operation not to speak of the mission outside the room. They would use only secured phone lines. Memos were to be hand written and personally delivered to lessen the number of individuals with knowledge of the mission. They were instructed not to "use the words Laos, POW (or) Detention Camp" outside the room.

The Joint Special Operations Command (known by the acronym JSOC, pronounced "J Sock") special operations team, under the code name Operation Pocket Change who would carry out the mission, was ready. Support teams were ready. The men in this room who carefully planned this mission were ready. All they needed was the confirmation of Americans held at the target and the green light to launch the mission.

Beginning in 1973, the U.S. Government had two very different policies on the issue of POWs and MIAs surviving in Southeast Asia. Publicly, the policy, re-enforced in 1976 by the U.S. House of Representatives' Select Committee on Missing Persons in Southeast Asia, declared no POWs survived in Southeast Asia after 1973. Yet, internally reports such as the classified Project X study clearly showed an official belief in the possibility of survival for some... [End Excerpt]


