

- 1. The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) Choice Card Program is a new, temporary benefit that will begin to cover non-VA care for eligible veterans already enrolled in VA health care. Veterans are eligible for Choice Card benefits if any of the following conditions apply: (1) they were told by their local VA medical facility that they need to wait more than 30 days from their preferred appointment date or the date medically determined by their physician; (2) their current residence is more than 40 miles to the closest VA health care facility; or (3) they face significant travel hardships to get to the nearest VA health care facility. For more information on the Choice Card Program, call 866-606-8198 or contact your county veterans service officer. Waukesha County (262-548-7732) Milwaukee County (414-266-1233).
- 2. The VA has new prescription drug labels. Your name has been moved to the top of the label. Directions on how to take your medication are now larger and bolded. The date the prescription can no longer be refilled is clearly stated. The new design makes it easier to identify important drug and safety information.
- **3.** The Milwaukee VA Medical Center, and Milwaukee VA Regional Office, will jointly host a Town Hall/Claims Clinic for Veterans, Service Members, & their families and survivors, to discuss VA benefits and health care. Community members and organizations that assist Veterans with their benefits, as well as the general public are also invited to attend. This town hall will be Saturday

March 7, 2015 from noon to 2:00 p.m. The Town Hall will take place at the Zablocki VA Medical Center.

BEN STEELE HONORED WITH CONGRESSIONAL RECORD TRIBUTE

Bataan Death March survivor Ben Steele picked up another honor Friday when U.S. Sen. Jon Tester stopped by the Billings veteran's home. Steele, 97, was presented with the transcript of a tribute, which Tester read into the Congressional Record last month. "I

appreciate what you've done for this country, what you've done for the state of Montana and the example you set for people all over this country. So, thank you Ben," Tester said.

The citation, entered into the Congressional Record, preserves Steele's role in U.S. history forever, Tester said. Steele was a 23-year-old soldier in the Philippines when the Japanese attacked in December 1941. Steele and the other soldiers were taken prisoner and forced from the Bataan Peninsula on a six-day march. Those who struggled along the way were shot or bayoneted to death. Steele spent more than three years in prison, drawing his experience on the concrete floor of his cell. He wasn't freed until after the United States dropped atomic bombs on Japan.

Steele pursued an art career after the war, teaching at Eastern Montana College in Billings for several years. An artist, he has been honored several times. Steele said it was a great honor for his story to be entered into the Congressional Record. Tester got a smile out of the veteran when he mentioned that Steele, as a boy, would sneak out of class under the pretense of going to the bathroom, but would go outside, saddle up a horse, and ride home.






