

V.A. News & Info:

- 1- Dodgy companies peddling pricey compound pharmaceuticals have fleeced the TRICARE program so severely this year, before tougher screening procedures took effect May 1, that they are largely to blame for a \$2 billion defense health budget hole Congress is scrambling to fill. In fiscal 2010, military outpatient pharmacy costs totaled \$6.6 billion, with only \$23 million spent on compound drugs. By fiscal 2014, outpatient pharmacy costs had risen to \$7.7 billion but compound drugs costs soared to \$515 million. In the first nine months of fiscal 2015, compound drug costs tripled again for TRICARE, to \$1.7 billion, or more than 20 percent of the \$8.2 billion TRICARE expects to spend on outpatient drugs the entire year.
- 2- The U.S. House of Representatives has approved legislation that would increase rates of benefit compensation for veterans with disabilities caused by their military service. Cost-of-living adjustments for veterans' disability benefits must be approved by Congress each year. Another provision based from legislation authored by Rep. Lee Zeldin (R-N.Y.), would require the VA to pay any accrued benefits to a deceased veteran's estate. The VA currently pays accrued benefits to a deceased veteran's family members, such as spouses or dependent children. But the VA keeps the benefit payments if the veteran dies without surviving qualifying family members.
- <u>3-</u> The American Legion is conducting a national online survey of veterans and their families through Aug. 16 to assess quality, timeliness, access and type of care the Department of Veterans Affairs is providing for those coping with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and/or traumatic brain injury (TBI). The 59-question survey at www.surveymonkey.com/s/9JJKVQ9 will be used to guide The American Legion's PTSD/TBI Committee. Questions are

mostly multiple-choice and can be answered with a single click from a dropdown menu. Personal information will not be used or made available to identify any individual who has completed the survey.



- Marines Heading Home -

Thanks to the efforts of History Flight, headed by Mark Noah, the remains of some 40 Marines buried on the island of Tarawa in 1943 as "Unknown" are on their way home. The following is excerpted from a July 27, 2015 CBS report by Megan Towey.

"More than 1,200 Marines died on Tarawa, and were hastily buried in makeshift graves as the war effort marched on. Hundreds are still buried there today in what is now the tiny Republic of Keera-Bass, under yards, trash pits, even pigsties "

This summer, a History Flight recovery team led by archeologist Kristen Baker unearthed a long-forgotten cemetery in Tarawa containing the remains of almost 40 Marines -- possibly the largest single recovery of American military remains ever.

One set of remains has already been positively identified as 1st Lt. Alexander Bonnyman Jr., whose actions in the Battle of Tarawa earned him a posthumous Medal of Honor.




